Prescription Drug Take Back a Success

The second Prescription Drug Take Back Event of 2011 took place on October 29th and brought members of the community together to collect people's unused prescription medications.

255 pounds of prescription medications were collected, brought in by 48 individuals throughout the morning.

"Nationally there has been an increase in prescription drug abuses, especially in young people," said Jessica Carter, Positive Pressure Coalition Coordinator. "We just want to provide an outlet where community members can take their old, expired, unused drugs. That way they know that their old prescriptions are being disposed of safely."

The Positive Pressure Coalition is a work group of Buffalo County Community Partners and exists to eliminate alcohol sales to minors and intoxicated persons.
