



Childcare Start Up Stipend Application – Family Child Care Homes I & II Powered by Buffalo County Community Partners

Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (Grant Number 90TP0079-03, of the USDHHS-Administration for Children and Families, Office of Early Childhood; Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services; Nebraska Department of Education; and Nebraska Children and Families Foundation) following grant requirements of 70% federal funding with 30% match from state and private resources.

Scope. A one-time \$1,000 stipend is available through an application process to any newly licensed childcare in-home from July 1, 2023, through April 29, 2024. This initiative is an opportunity to increase childcare capacity in Buffalo County. It is made possible through Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA) and Communities for Kids (C4K) Preschool Development grant funds and powered by the Buffalo County Early Childhood Collaborative (BCECC). The BCECC facilitates community conversations that lead to opportunities for young children to learn, grow, and develop in high-quality, safe, and loving environments. BCECC was started to strengthen partnerships among agencies, increase parent engagement, and support childcare providers while continuing to identify gaps and barriers and build on strengths within our community surrounding early childhood.

Funding Source. The Childcare Start Up Stipend is funded by CRRSA and C4K. These funds are specifically designated to increase enrollment capacity in Buffalo County. Allocation of funds is a one-time \$1,000 stipend for newly licensed Family Child Care Homes I and Family Child Care Homes II serving children ages birth to 5-years. These funds are allowable to be used toward operation of applicants newly licensed childcare program. This program may be disbanded if funding should be discontinued or materially reduced.

Eligibility. A new, not yet licensed, Family Child Care Home with the intent to obtain a provisional and eventually operating license. Application Requirements. Applications are reviewed ongoing from July 1, 2023, through April 29, 2024, until funding has been used. Participating programs will:

- 1. Register in Child Care Referral Network (CCRN) and update their program info
- 2. Register program staff in Nebraska Early Childhood Professional Record System (NECPRS) and update their records a minimum of once per quarter if there are any additions
- 3. Achieve Step Up to Quality Step One
- 4. Participate in one of the following:

- 5. Complete baseline survey when provider or program initially receives funds, 6-months after receiving the funds, and at the end of CRRSA/ARP contract. <u>CRRSA/ARP Data Collection Survey</u>
