Violence trends for Buffalo County have stayed consistent the past

decade. Females are still more apt to be physically hurt by a partner or adult. However, 15% of all youth report receiving a provocative photo by text or email.



#### **Research Methods**

Every two to three years, Buffalo County Community Partners collaborates with the Nebraska Departments of Education and Health and Human Services to administer and analyze the Nebraska Risk and Protective Factor Student Survey. Data from Buffalo County were collected from a representative sample of Buffalo County youth between October and January 2023. In all, 1,023 Buffalo County youth, in grades 9-12, completed the 2023 survey, providing a snapshot of their physical and mental health, as well as behaviors that might pose risks to their health and safety.
