### Trends 2012-2023

For most of this period, the data for Buffalo County youth tracks closely to the results for respondents from other parts of Nebraska.

All categories show a reduction in 2023 from prior years starting in 2016.

### Difference between male and female

The data presented on these tables and graphs show that young women suffer in greater numbers than young men in Buffalo County. In every measure of emotional distress, the percentage of female respondents reporting a listed condition is significantly higher than the number of male respondents reporting that condition. The persistence of this pattern suggests systemic causes. However, in suicidal contemplation across the state, the gap between males and females lessens.

Data from Buffalo County were collected from a representative sample of Buffalo County youth between October and December 2023. In all, 1023 Buffalo County youth in grades 9-12, completed the survey.
